**1996:** 1 children's home, 39 youths, and 11 handicapped children

**1997:** 1 married couple, 2 university students, and 8 handicapped children

**1998:** 3 children's homes, 11 youths, 1 married couple, 5 university students, and 8 handicapped children

**1999:** 1 children's home, 3 married couples, 1 students, 9 handicapped children, 18 youths, 2 child-births

**2000:** 1 married couple, 9 handicapped children, and 19 youths

**2001:** 4 married couples, 8 handicapped children, 31 youths, and 3 child-births

**2002:** 1 married couple, 8 handicapped children, 19 youths, and 1 child-birth.

**2003:** 1 married couple, 2 youngsters

## CHARACTER OF SUPPORTS

**Help to renovate social residences into habitable state, advance payments for sublease**

**Education: tuition fees (university, college, course), school equipment, computers**

**Critical states: illness, medicine, birth, arrears with rent, social problems**
